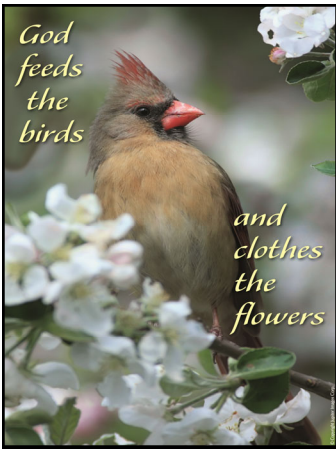

HIGH ANXIETY

With all our worries about the economy, unemployment, healthcare, and terrorists, you'd think we have a lot more anxieties than the folks in Jesus' time. Yet people then had just as many anxieties and worries. So is Jesus telling people not to be concerned for their families or the poor when he tells us not to worry about food or clothing? No; concern is not the same as worry. Concern is love that asks what I can do for someone else in need. Worry is fear that I can't do anything to help either myself or others. Love leads us to act on the problem; fear tempts us to flee from the problem. Jesus encourages us not to worry with examples from the natural world. The birds are fed and the grass is clothed with flowers, all through no efforts of their own. Jesus is not saying that we can drift through life with no purpose and still get whatever we want. He gives us a definite purpose--to seek first the kingdom of God. If we seek God first, we'll begin to see that our worries are needless. If knowing and loving God is the center of our lives, then we have no time or inclination for fear and worry. And that is where the concern comes in. One description of the Kingdom is the realization that all things come from God and that God lives in all people. When we seek to bring the kingdom of God into reality, we are concerned for all the poor, the sick, the dying. The Kingdom means seeing God in others, so that when we see those who are sick or in trouble, we are seeing Jesus on the cross. When we help someone whose faith is weak, they may see Jesus in us. By showing God's love to them, we can help free them from worry also. And they can help us to understand Jesus' words, "You cannot serve both God and mammon." We can't serve God when we are worrying about paying bills, saving for retirement, or getting the kids through college. 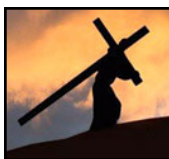
Mission Statement
